Canfield Township Trustees, in cooperation with the Ohio Department of Transportation, District 4 proposes the installation of Gabion Baskets and additional aggregate along an unnamed tributary to Indian Run on the southern edge of the property located at 3765 Mercedes Place, Canfield Township, Mahoning County, Ohio.

The project proposes the installation of 102 linear feet of Gabion Baskets along the northern embankment of the stream channel and the re-establishment of vegetative cover and placement of aggregate along the toe-of-slope of the southern embankment of the stream channel to stop erosion and stabilize the embankment. Additional improvements include concrete slab work and asphalt resurfacing. Construction is anticipated to begin on this project by May 2018 and shall be completed by July 2018.

The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable Federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried-out by ODOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated [December 11, 2015], and executed by FHWA and ODOT. The proposed project will not impact any cultural resources, suspect hazardous waste sites or result in any substantial impacts to ecological resources. The project will not result in any impacts to the environment either individually or cumulatively. In compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (codified as 36 CFR 800), Canfield Township requests information regarding the presence of any known cultural resources in the vicinity of the project. Cultural resources include prehistoric and historic archaeological sites, historic bridges, historic buildings, sites and districts.

To ensure the proposed project is viable and successful, Canfield Township is seeking comments from the public about the social, environmental, and economic impacts of this proposed project. Environmental impacts include those involving archeological, architectural and ecological resources, regulated materials and the general location of the project. Any comments you may have regarding the environmental and/or the proposed project may be submitted by **February 5, 2018**.
